Involvement of nurses and midwives in clinical decisions regarding the eligibility criteria for cesarean section among pregnant women.

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NOTE ONE

The nurse is the most trusted healthcare team member according to a Gallup survey (Newport, 2012). For this reason, nurses are in an excellent position to advocate for the patient's right to autonomy and informed decision making



NOTE TWO

However, one challenging question constantly nags the nurse's ethical core—what is the role of the nurse in futile treatment decisions? Many nurses are faced with this common situation in which doctors are allowed to override patient autonomy with physician autonomy

NOTE THREE

More effort is needed to increase nurses' involvement because treatments are often made in a dialogue between a patient and their physician, with a focus on active treatment but nurses can have a valuable contribution in this process, but it seems they are not always involved.

NOTE FOUR

Nurses play a role in the timely provision and sharing of information in the treatment decision-making process, based on a relationship of trust with the patient.





NOTE FIVE

Some patients are reluctant to share personal information, eg willing to be operated but nurses should focus on building trusting relationships with them. (Hiroko Komatsu and Yasuhiro Komatsu (2023))

NOTE SEVEN

Its more useful to involve nurses and midwives in clinical decisions regarding the eligibility criteria for cesarean section among pregnant women as they play important role in patients preferences.
