#### Nursing

- Nursing is a healthcare profession focused on the care of individuals, families, and communities to help them achieve, maintain, or recover optimal health and quality of life (WHO, ANA)
- Professionals in nursing are responsible for assessing patients' health, administering drugs, providing psycho-social support and health education to patients, families, and the community

## Midwifery

- Midwifery is a healthcare profession that specializes in providing care to women at pre-pregnancy, during pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum period.
- Midwives are responsible for prenatal care, labor and delivery, and postnatal care
- They are accountable for health and well-being of both mother and baby

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#### **Clinical Practice**

- According to WHO, Clinical practice refers to the application of medical knowledge and skills in realworld settings to ensure the possible outcomes for individual patients and the communities.
- WHO guidelines recommends evidence-based practice to healthcare providers to make informed decisions regarding medical interventions, diagnostic tests, or public interventions



#### Health Education

- According to WHO, health education focuses on influencing individual behaviors, raising awareness about the social, environmental, and political factors that determine health
- It collectively promotes actions to modify determinants.
- Health education aimed at fostering health literacy, empowering individuals and communities to control critical thinking, interaction, and participation



# Targets for Innovation in Nursing and Midwifery

- Main target for innovation in nursing and midwifery:
  - Improving patient care
  - Addressing health needs
  - Enhancing the efficiency of healthcare systems



Reasons for Innovation in Nursing and Midwifery
Improving patient outcomes:

- New technologies, tools, and approaches in nursing and midwifery can lead to better outcomes
- For example, innovations in patient monitoring, telemedicine, and personalized care

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Reasons for Innovation in Nursing and
Midwifery (2)
Adapting to healthcare challenges:

 Challenges such as care of aging populations, chronic diseases management, and global pandemics

 Developing new models of care, such as community-based services or telehealth can address these challenges

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# Reasons for Innovation in Nursing and Midwifery (3)

- Improving access to care:
  - In areas with limited healthcare access, innovative practices such as mobile health clinics, telemedicine, and task-shifting can empower nurses to serve remote populations

Reasons for Innovation in Nursing and Midwifery (4)

Empowering nurses and midwives:
 Innovations provide tools for nurses and

midwives to expand their roles in healthcare systems

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 Involving them in leadership and policymaking advances practice roles



# Reasons for Innovation in Nursing and Midwifery (5) Addressing workforce shortages:

- The global shortage of healthcare professionals, particularly in nursing, innovations in education and technology, can alleviate some of work pressure
- Initiating online training programs (and robotic assistance) in clinical settings help train and support healthcare workers

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# Reasons for Innovation in Nursing and Midwifery (6)

- Fostering evidence based practice:
  - Research and innovation foster a culture of evidence-based practice
  - It ensures nurses and midwives use the most effective, up to date methods and interventions

Empowering Patients and families:

- Implement educational programs for patients and their families
- This will make patients or relatives to be active participants in care and improve satisfaction

Innovative strategies for Health Education (2)

Continuous Feedback and Assessment Tools:

 Digital Feedback Systems: Use online platforms where patients or relative receive individualized feedback



## Innovative strategies for Health Education (3)

Health Literacy Improvement:

- Train nurses to assess and improve health literacy among patients from diverse populations
- Ensuring patients understand their care plans and can participate in decision-making
